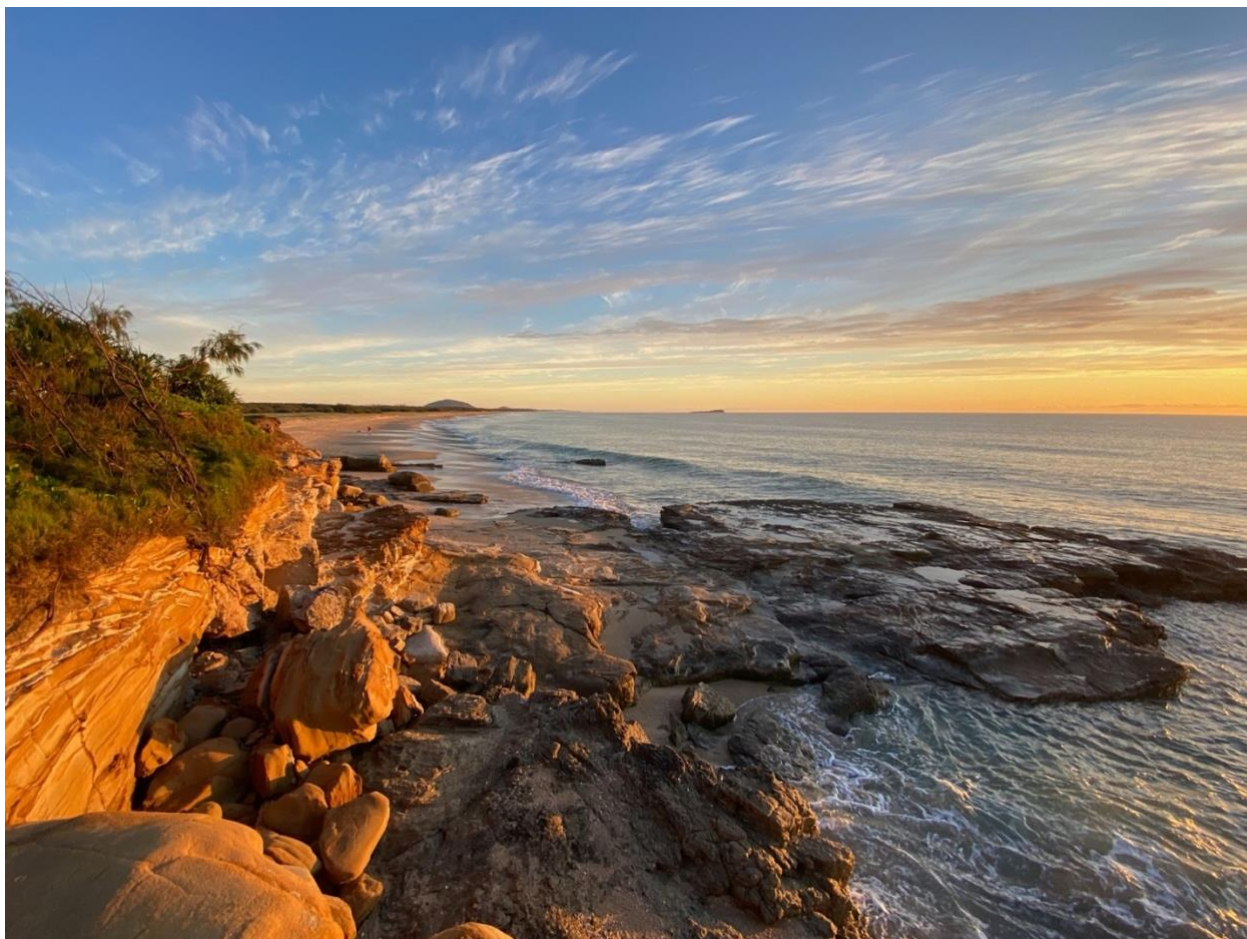

It was a bittersweet start to the 2021 season! A new workshop area provided such a welcome relief to be able to store equipment and provide good usable space to manage the forever ongoing repairs. Thank you to the many members, who over many years have invested time and funds to make the recent building extensions a reality.

The reality of engines sitting idle on racks during covid in a sandy, salty environment meant that we had to deal with more repairs and seized parts than you usually would at the beginning of the season. Without the budget to fund everything required, we had a shaky start to the season with numerous engines down while we scavenged parts from one motor for another to keep a very small fleet running for patrol.

Maintaining our boats and motors has been an ongoing juggle this season with fundraising previously raised by the IRB Surf Sports team, utilised to service 4 motors and fund a major repair of another. It really takes a village to keep our gear functioning in good working order! Due to COVID and the cleaner engines legislation: Surf Lifesaving and the military are the only bodies

that are provided with an exemption to be able to continue to purchase new 2 stroke engines, there is a serious shortage and often unavailability of spare parts – so we continue to scavenge and juggle.

This season we've spent time tracking the hours of use for each engine and hull, service records and repairs for each engine and hull, the costs; and created a record of the many incidental pieces of equipment that are required to keep the IRBs on the water. As a result, we now know what budget we need for next season.

Without the support of the IRB Surf sports team and 2 very committed individuals, we wouldn't have managed to keep the IRBs on the beach and the cost required to repair and maintain the equipment would be at least double. Phill Burke (the 2-stroke whisperer) and Ned Carson have invested more hours than would be possible to count repairing boats and motors. They are in the workshop every weekend 12 months of the year. Maintaining the motors doesn't stop when the patrolling season ends. I am thankful the IRB team train during winter as that's when the majority of the maintenance occurs on the boats. The team without question, has spent days cleaning down boats, patching Hypalon, cutting Solas tape and adhering it to boats, repairing valves, servicing recoil assemblies and carburettors – the list is exhaustive.





The nature of the 2-stroke in the environment we work in requires many hours of maintenance, with some very fine and small (and surprisingly expensive) components that requires gentle handling; yet out on the water, the more those engines are run, the better they perform and the less maintenance is required. Treat them with kindness, don't leave them idle on the sand for hours, wash them down with care and patience and drive them like you stole them 😊

Bring on 2022 season and many more new Drivers and Crew

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Financial Reporting Framework

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland)*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Statement of Compliance

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Queensland)*, the basis of accounting specified by all Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of Accounting Standards AASB 101: *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 108: *Accounting Policies*, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054: *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

Basis of Preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs. They do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Club is exempt from income tax in accordance with Section 50-45 of the IncomeTax Assessment Act 1997.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Buildings	2.5%
Gear and equipment	25.0%
Motor vehicles	30.0%

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Leases

The Association as lessee

At inception of a contract, the Association assesses if the contract contains or is a lease. If there is a lease present, a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability is recognised by the Association where the Association is a lessee. However, all contracts that are classified as short-term leases (ie a lease with a remaining lease term of 12 months or less) and leases of low-value assets are recognised as an operating expense on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

Concessionary Leases

For leases that have significantly below-market terms and conditions principally to enable the Association to further its objectives (commonly known as peppercorn/concessionary leases), the Association has adopted the temporary relief under AASB 2018-820 and measures the right-of-use assets at cost on initial recognition.

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(j) Revenue

Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Operating grants and donations

When the association receives operating grant revenue or donations, it assesses whether the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15.

When both these conditions are satisfied, the Association:

- identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant;
- recognises a contract liability for its obligations under the agreement; and
- recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Association:

- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable Accounting Standards (for example, AASB 9, AASB 16, AASB 116 and AASB 138);
- recognises related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer); and
- recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

If a contract liability is recognised as a related amount above, the association recognises income in profit or loss when or as it satisfies its obligations under the contract.

Capital grants

When the association receives a capital grant, it recognises a liability for the excess of the initial carrying amount of the financial asset received over any related amounts (being contributions by owners, lease liability, financial instruments, provisions, revenue or contract liability arising from a contract with a customer) recognised under other Australian Accounting Standards.

The association recognises income in profit or loss when or as the association satisfies its obligations under the terms of the grant.

Interest income

Interest income is recognised using the effective interest method.

Income from sale of goods

Revenue is recognised when control of the products has transferred to the customer. For such transactions, this is when the products are delivered to the customers. Revenue is then only recognised to the extent that there is a high probability that a significant reversal of revenue will not occur.

A receivable will be recognised when the goods are delivered. The Association's right to consideration is deemed unconditional at this time as only the passage of time is required before payment of that consideration is due.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.
