PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hello members,

As we close out the season 2024 - 2025 I would like to start by thanking our 520 members, we have 117 active members and 240 nippers this season. Thank you for all you have contributed to the Club and the larger community this season. We have contributed to a valuable service to our community and the travelling public once again. It has been a successful season for our Club and beach, with many positive actions over the season ensuring our beach going public went home safe to their family and friends. This is our core task – why we are here.

Again, our Club boasts some impressive statistics, they give us the best method of providing quantity to what we do. As I said last year, the statistics do not tell the full story though, and there are statistics that sound more positive than the story they really tell.

Some of those statistics for you:

- *We had over 49,065 visitors to the beach.*
- *We conducted 2 rescues (down from 14 last season), 27 major first aid & 46 minor first aid treatments.*
- *944 preventative actions*
- *152 scheduled patrols conducted*
- *At least 2 land searches conducted.*

Last season I spoke about near miss incidents and how close those were to becoming far more serious. This remains true as always, and I do not want to brush past those figures. Despite the second half of the season providing some challenging conditions both in weather and beach availability, our members continued to provide that level of



support to the general swimming public in all circumstances, to stop those near misses becoming a tragic incident.

There are some statistics we do need to address as a Club and as individual members.

At one point in the season, Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club led the state in member injuries resulting from power craft use. Thankfully, nothing too serious but, all a cause for concern to those members and their families. This is a statistic we can reduce with training processes, practice and better decisions in the water. Every injury report that comes through the Club is a concern and we need to work harder to reduce the pain and stress to our members. This is both a Club and individual endeavour.

This season, we took on a lot of change. In fact, if I could sum up the season from my perspective it has all been about change. Change that was brought about to ultimately improve patrolling and club life for all our members. I acknowledge that change is difficult, and we certainly had many teething issues over the season.

We looked to address the risk of patrols defaulting by consolidating two patrols and reducing our patrol groups from 9 to 8 patrols. The aim has always been, and will remain, to grow back into 9 patrols and beyond, and have our members patrolling less over the season.

The patrol roster reflected the changes to the number of patrol teams and as a result, all 8 patrols had 19 rostered patrols for the season. Meaning each member had 95 rostered hours for the season, not including water safety and other additional patrol related tasks. The number of 100-hour caps awarded this season shows the high number of members attending the beach far more than they need to. Volunteer fatigue is something that SLSQ has identified statewide, and we have certainly seen that this season at Mudjimba.



Ironically, it does need to be this way. Our active patrolling membership stands at 119 members. Mudjimba could have 10 patrols with those numbers. Allowing for absences, even at 60%, with 6 to 7 award members on the beach, 10 active patrol groups is achievable. We remain victims of our own making. This is a statistic we can change ourselves.

Our Club has continued to engage with some of our local community groups such as the North Shore Lions, Mudjimba RSL, Bendigo Bank, Mudjimba Residents' Association and of course our major sponsor, Joanne Reilly Property who has provided wonderful support.

Financially, the Club is in a positive position. This has been built on the hard work of the Grants officer and others that have helped to raise funds at the Club by assisting in the extra tasks that come our way. This means our membership fees can remain static for at least the 2025 - 2026 season. But I anticipate that the executive will need to reassess the membership fees again next season, with insurance premiums continuing to impact our members.

We have looked to positively move on other income avenues for the Club. We are investigating monthly market options among other ideas. Our updated Strategic Plan is nearly complete. I hope to have the final draft available to our membership in July. This document is important as it will give us and our potential club donors, an idea of the direction we want to head into. It will outline what we want the Club to be, both physically in terms of structures and assets, and ideologically.

In terms of equipment, again the Club has benefited from some high-end purchases. Our rescue watercraft, Bronny, was introduced and a growing cohort of operators have made use of it in acquiring new skills and providing new options to our Club. We purchased a tractor which has brought a lot of smiles and versatility to our beach access. We have a new patrol trailer giving us some new capabilities on the beach



to make our time spent there a little more enjoyable. I'd like to thank Karac Eden in particular, for the work that he has contributed to ensure this new equipment is available for use by our members.

We received new training equipment as well and we continue to update our training to include the latest methods and aids to assist us all to gain a better outcome when needed.

The first aid room and lifesaving office floor was upgraded. We added some sound improvements to the Island room and had the audio-visual equipment upgraded. The weather intervened again in this area, but we were able to work through the shortages caused by electrical surge damage. We still have upgrade plans within the clubhouse to work through. We'd like to see those plans come to fruition, but they remain grant dependent at this stage.

New equipment leads to storage issues within the clubhouse. This is a problem we are looking to solve, and communications continue with the Sunshine Coast Branch and SLSQ to that end.

The clubhouse hosted its first wedding, Andrea Fesselet's daughter, Bonnie & her (now) husband Scott's wedding was held in early September. We wish them all the best.





This season I have had the chance to engage with some more of our youth than in previous seasons. For anyone that is been involved with nippers – and I’d think that would be most of us, you’ll know what I mean when I say it’s a rewarding task. The youth are a step above and bring an extra enthusiasm that is a credit to previous nipper seasons, their ongoing training and the influences they get at home and on the beach. With strong nipper numbers again this season, I feel our youth cohort will be strong for the years to come. Our challenge is to keep them engaged and maintain their interest while with us.

Finally, to the membership in general, the Club remains viable because of your ongoing efforts both on the sand and with the general surf club tasks. Without you, the Club fails. We remain successful only because of you. Thank you all. Thank you also to our sponsors and patrons for supporting our Club. I remain a very proud member of Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club

NEW LIFE MEMBER

Sarah Windsor - Introduction by Darrin Edwards



Sarah is a very long-serving patrol member having patrolled for more than 21 seasons. She was instrumental in supporting the Mudjimba Nipper Program in our first seasons of introducing the Nipper Program by being the swim coach for all age groups. Sarah is meticulous in her attendance at patrols or substituting any patrols she may need to miss or to support other patrols requiring support for member absences. Whilst on patrol,

Sarah upholds the highest standards of patrolling whilst still finding energy to be a fantastic patrol member.

It is in Surf Sports that Sarah excels at the highest possible levels. Sarah is the most highly decorated competitor in the Club's history with multiple medal success at Club, Branch, State, National and World Title levels.

Sarah has been the Club's Open Club Champion almost every year for the past 21 years. She has represented Australia 21 times across 3 different aquatic sports: Australian Swimming, Australian Royal Lifesaving and Australian Surf Lifesaving.



She Captained the Australian Royal Lifesaving Team from 2003 - 2009 during which time she broke the world record for 200m obstacles which she held for 4 years, attended numerous Commonwealth and World Cup events accumulating dozens of medals.

Sarah has had many podium finishes at Branch, State and Aussie's. As a member of the Australian Surf Lifesaving Team, she brought home 2 gold and 2 silver medals from the World Rescue Championships in Italy in 2004. On home turf at the same event in 2006 at Lorne, Australia, she won 4 gold, 3 silver and 4 bronze medals. Once again at World Rescue Championships in 2008 in Germany she won 5 gold, 2 silver and 4 bronze medals. Sarah retired from Open Competitions at the World Games in Taiwan where she collected 2 silver medals.



Sarah was a member of the Nutrigrain Surf Lifesaving Series Squad for a couple of seasons. The list of Gold Medal performances was too vast to tabulate but is exceptional even when compared against any surf lifesaver at any club in Australia (and probably beyond).

It is for her more than 21 years of outstanding service to Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club, her exceptional swim coaching of the Mudjimba Nipper Program, and her world-class Surf Sports achievements that Sarah has been recognised with Life Membership to our club.

It has been a privilege to serve as Deputy President of Mudjimba Surf Life Saving Club during the 2024–25 season—a year marked by growth, resilience, and our continued commitment to community. I sincerely appreciated the advice and support from members throughout the season.

One of the great strengths of our Club is its people. From our patrol members and trainers to the Nipper families, surf sports teams, coaches and behind-the-scenes volunteers, each of you plays a vital role in keeping our beach safe and our Club vibrant. We are also incredibly lucky to be supported by our excellent administration team, Bronnie and Lynn, who achieve so much for our Club each week despite limited time. This year, I saw especially strong participation across our education and training programs, a successful Nippers season, 100% patrol coverage and enthusiastic engagement in community initiatives.

This season, we completed 16 significant building maintenance and upgrade tasks, with 13 more in progress, enhancing safety, usability, and presentation (details in the table below). Highlights included the replacement of flooring in the First Aid and Lifesaving Office thanks to a Sunshine Coast Council grant, upgrades to access security, and the next stage of enhancements to the kiosk area. These works reflect the Club's continued focus on maintaining functional, safe, and welcoming spaces that support patrols, training, and community activities. The Building Committee's efforts have been instrumental in keeping the Clubhouse in excellent working order and I also want to thank the



many hands that contributed to a variety of tasks around our Clubhouse.

Our surf sports teams also had a standout season, with achievements that reflect the strength and camaraderie of our broader Club community. The Masters team placed third at the Hervey Bay carnival, and more than 20 Mudjimba Masters athletes proudly competed at Yamba, demonstrating our camaraderie. Our IRB team delivered strong performances in the Ocean Roar Series, showing both skill and teamwork in fast-paced, high-pressure conditions. Across our junior ranks, we saw growing participation in carnivals throughout the season, with an increasing number of Nippers giving competitive surf lifesaving a go and building confidence and skills along the way.

We continue to look ahead, leveraging the specific strengths of our Club while identifying opportunities to do more—especially in areas such as member pathways, retention, and training innovation. It’s an exciting time to be part of the Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club story, and I am so grateful to everyone who contributed to the Club’s achievements this year.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING

It is with great pleasure that I present my first annual report as Club Captain of Mudjimba Surf Life Saving Club for the 2024–2025 season. Taking on this role has been a rewarding experience that has seen me grow as a person. I am incredibly proud of what our patrol teams have achieved together over the past season. This season saw positive operational changes, a reinvigorated club culture, and a strong commitment to keeping our beach and community safe.

Operational Highlights and Safety Improvements

This year, we introduced several significant improvements that enhanced both safety and patrol functionality. A major step forward was the purchase of a new tractor, which has greatly improved the safety and efficiency for maneuvering equipment on and off the beach. We also instituted a new patrol arena, making patrol days more enjoyable for our members.

One of our most notable successes was achieving 100% patrol coverage of all patrols. This is a testament to the dedication, reliability, and commitment of our patrolling members.

We also introduced the RWC (Rescue Water Craft) as part of our standard patrol setup. This improved our response capability for every patrol. Supporting this initiative, our patrol members were successful in gaining three full Marine Licenses and six PWC Licenses, ensuring a solid base of qualified operators for the future.

Challenges and Growth Areas

Despite the many positives, this season was not without its challenges. Member flexibility and accountability emerged as key concerns, particularly as we transitioned from nine patrol groups down to eight,



despite having 119 active patrolling members. In theory, the club could have 10 patrols and this would have still allowed for healthy team sizes. Balancing the preferences of individuals with the operational demands of the club will be an area for renewed focus for the 2025 – 2026 season.

We also saw an increase in marine-related incidents, adding pressure to some patrols, as well as a rise in member injuries. While our teams responded professionally and effectively, these trends highlight the need for continuous training, vigilance, and risk awareness.

Looking Back and Moving Forward

Despite these challenges, this season signifies a clear and meaningful improvement from where we began. The growth in team cohesion, professionalism, and operational capability has been significant. I want to take this opportunity to thank each of the 119 active patrolling members for your efforts, consistency, and spirit that have driven this progress and set a strong foundation for next season.

Acknowledgements

A heartfelt thank you goes out to the patrol captains, trainers, committee members, and support personnel who have backed me throughout this first season. Your advice, encouragement, and hard work have made all the difference.

Conclusion

In closing, the 2024–2025 season has been one of growth, improvement, and renewed purpose. I’m proud of how far we’ve come as a Club, and I’m excited to build on this momentum as we look to the 2025–2026 season. Together, we are continuing to shape Mudjimba SLSC into a strong, responsive and inclusive surf lifesaving club.


