PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As we close out the season 2025 - 2026 I would like to start by thanking all of you, our 565 members. We have 127 active members, 10 honorary long service, 11 honorary life members, 1 community member, 221 nippers and 195 associate members this season. Most of those numbers have increased since last season. Thank you for all that you have contributed to the club and the larger community this season. We continue to provide a valuable service to our community and the travelling beach going public once again. It has been a successful season between the red and yellow flags for our club, with many positive actions over the season ensuring our beach going public went home safe to their family and friends. This is our core task – why we are here.

Again, our club boasts some impressive statistics. They give us the best method of quantifying what we do, however the statistics do not tell the full story.

- *We had over 53,000 visitors to the beach*
- *We conducted 13 rescues, and 154 first aid treatments*
- *443 preventative actions*
- *152 scheduled patrols conducted*
- *1 missing persons search conducted*

Sadly, our stretch of coastline saw its share of tragedy with at least two drownings and a third that we are yet to have confirmation on. We had several serious events with more positive outcomes in that same area of coastline. While these events were outside of the flags, they are a stark reminder of how easily the situation can



change on a swimmer. These events have a profound effect on family, friends, the lifeguard community and our members. I experienced the grief and appreciation for the lifesaving efforts personally and I'd like to commend our Club Captain, Karac Eden, for his efforts in November of 2025. As a club we need to remember to support our members that are involved in these events. Check in on them regularly and remember to use the resources that SLSQ makes available to us in order to assist and work through the residual effects.

I remain frustrated at the lack of media attention the drownings on the Sunshine Coast attracts. I tend to hear about tragic events on other coastlines and in other states, but rarely in our neighbourhood, with the tragic loss of Joe Tolano being the exception. There is little support from the council (it seems) in getting the word out to the public that there are areas of our coastline that are prone to danger. And SLSQ's response to a request for better awareness campaigns led to a social media release that was given to members to help spread the word. That to me seems like preaching to the converted and in my experience those posts do not travel far in a member's social circle. The end result is our club members addressing swimmers and beach goers who ignore the red flags and other signed warnings - sometimes within hours of the last tragic event. I sincerely hope this changes.

We patrol over 7 months of the year, which includes 3 sets of school holidays and the majority of the public holidays. These are the periods that attract the most visitors to the beach and anyone who has been patrolling for a few seasons will tell you that Mudjimba Beach numbers are growing.

I mentioned last season that the high number of 100 hour caps we hand out at our awards night is a thank you to our members for their efforts on the sand and in the water. This high number also highlights an issue of volunteer fatigue. Ideally all patrols should have had a rostered 18 patrols over the 25/26 season. If you attended all patrols you should have 90 hours logged, less if you missed a couple but more if you assisted with water safety or filled in for another member. Greater



than 100 hours highlights to me that we are asking a lot of you, as a patrolling member. Most of you volunteer your time willingly and I thank you for it.

Of course, these days we do a lot more than just patrol the beach. We support external agencies with their events, providing first aid, water safety and drinks stations. We support Christmas functions, community groups and other charities. We conduct camps and water park activities. We have youth gatherings and water based excursions to Mudjimba Island. Some of our members have assisted members of the public away from the beach and club, with the skills they have attained here – often bringing great credit to the club and surf lifesaving in general. Those are the messages I like to receive. Our club has continued to engage with community groups such as the Maroochy North Shore Lions, Mudjimba RSL and of course we enjoy the wonderful support of our major sponsor, Joanne Reilly Property and other contributors, Bendigo Bank, the Sunshine Coast Council and the Honourable Fiona Simpson. Our nippers have enjoyed the support of Lever Law, Nomadic, J&J Plumbing, Sunshine Coast Solar & Battery and Sunny Laundromat. Thank you all for helping to make our season successful.

Unfortunately, some of our members have been injured this season. While most of the injuries were sporting in nature and thankfully not too serious, we did have a serious injury while conducting patrolling activities. For me this is truly worrying. While all of those members should make a full recovery, the pain, inconvenience and recovery time is something that we need to work to avoid in future.

We need to acknowledge the loss of some important members. Sadly, we lost Mick Coleman early in the season, a foundation and life member of the club who quite literally laid foundations to the building. His loss was felt by all members and I was pleased that we were able to remember him in two special services held for him. We lost Ian Windsor earlier this year. Ian was instrumental in the inception of the Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club and served as the club's Honorary Solicitor. His family members are still patrolling with us now. Both of these losses serve to remind us of the blessings we have here at the beach. We will remember them both.

Financially, the club is in a positive position. This is largely due to the hard work of our ever monitoring Treasurer, Narelle Robertson and the efforts of our Grants



Officer, Steve Shipman. Of course, there are many others who have helped to raise funds at the club by assisting in the extra tasks that come our way.

The Saltwater Saturdays Night Market, in partnership with Sunshine Coast Music and Events, has been a popular addition to the community. The club receives a small benefit in fees and we have been in ongoing discussions about how we can improve the whole concept to suit all parties.



I am very pleased to announce that our membership fees can once again, remain static for our next season. This is a conscious effort to try to reward the hard work put in by our membership. As with last year, the executive will need to reassess the membership fees again before the next season, with insurance premiums and other inflationary costs continuing to impact the club's operating costs. However, the executive remains committed to look for financial gains and ways to better support our membership.

Our strategic plan review was completed. We now need to review our progress against our goals to remain focused to what we can achieve. This document is important as it gives us and our potential club donors an idea of the direction we are heading. It outlines what we want the club to be, both physically in terms of structures and assets, and ideologically.

As SLSQ and the Sunshine Coast Branch update their constitutions, I see the need to bring the club's constitution into line. This will be a fantastic opportunity to modernise a lot of the historic language used and update our primary guiding document to help us define our purpose as we move forward. Subsequently, the club's bylaws will need amending. Many of these reflect club roles and processes that are now either altered or obsolete. These bylaws are our day to day guide to club operations and should be reviewed as a matter of priority.



This season has also seen a change in the way we communicate with our members, particularly our junior members. The restrictions on social media platforms for those under 16 along with the changing child protections being put in place, mean that even What's App is functionally inappropriate as there is the opportunity to misuse that medium. 1:1 contact with a minor still possible through this application. SLSQ has a preference in using the Team App for club communications as it has a number of benefits such as keeping phone numbers private and it restricts 1:1 contact. I do see a future where this application (or something similar) will be the only method approved for use by SLSQ. The club should look to transfer our group communications across for the next season.

In terms of equipment, again the club has benefited from some high end purchases. Our second rescue watercraft was introduced and a growing cohort of operators have acquired the skills to operate it, providing new options for our club. Seeing the new operators in the water using this equipment, gaining confidence and experience is one of the more pleasing parts of patrolling and I've had the great pleasure to answer enquiries on the beach from interested beach goers about the skills of our operators. I do so with great pride that you all deserve.



We received new training equipment as well and we continue to update our training processes to include the latest methods and aids, assisting us all to gain a better outcome when needed. Our training continues to lead the way under our Chief Training Officer – Jill Penridge. The initiatives in training have won awards and helped the club gain new and valuable members. But more importantly, it has helped our members perform rescues and conduct our operations in a truly professional manner. Some of our most junior members (not just in age) have been involved in serious activities within weeks of completing the relevant training. They have done so with confidence and have had successful outcomes as a result. Well done to our trainers and assessors.



Again, the growth in our equipment leads to storage issues within the clubhouse. The continual “Tetris” we play every patrol day when manoeuvring our equipment in the clubhouse is something we look to improve upon. But as we have come to the limits of what we can physically store, we look towards the idea of expansion or consolidation. This is a problem we are looking to solve in the future.

This year marks the 30th anniversary of Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club. It is an historical time period and something that we should all celebrate. Before we do, take a moment to reflect on all the club has achieved. How many members has the club trained and upskilled over the years? The club’s first nippers are now in their early to mid 30’s! Reflect on your own journey through the club and where it has taken you in that time – no matter how brief it has been. I’ll bet you are in a better position now than when you started as a result. Consider what the club means to the community over that time period. I look at some of our neighbouring clubs with 50 and 100 years and project our club at those anniversaries. Where will we be and how will you help us get there? Exciting times. Let’s celebrate!

Finally, to our membership. I will say again the club remains viable because of your ongoing efforts in all of the club’s tasks. We remain successful only because of you. I hope that we can continue our happy, friendly and family attractive club for many more years to come. Thank you all for supporting Mudjimba Surf Lifesaving Club.

This list reflects patrolling hours only and does not include Water Safety or other volunteer contributions. All members who have achieved 100 hours across all forms of volunteering will be formally recognised at our upcoming awards night. It is the collective effort of every member—and the countless hours they contribute to both the club and the community—that makes Mudjimba such a strong and successful grassroots club.

Reflecting on the season, we faced a number of challenges from start to finish. Members were required to patrol every fortnight, with increased commitments during peak holiday periods. Despite demanding conditions and high beach attendance, Mudjimba maintained a strong, professional presence and a proactive approach to keep our beachgoers safe.

Throughout the season, we experienced firsthand the challenges that our stretch of coastline can present. Unpredictable weather systems and shifting surf conditions calling for high alertness and preventative actions, including several beach closures to ensure the safety of our members and the community. Our patrol teams consistently went above and beyond their primary surveillance duties, responding to multiple rescues and mass-rescue incidents. These were situations that could have resulted in tragic outcomes without the high level of training, preparedness, and professionalism that Mudjimba members continue to uphold. Despite these demanding circumstances, we successfully maintained **zero preventable deaths between the red and yellow flags**.

Looking ahead to next season, I have once again put my hand up for the role of Club Captain. It is a privilege to lead such a passionate and capable group of volunteers.

Our Patrol Service Agreement is due for review and renewal this season, and I intend to use this opportunity to advocate for proactive changes in areas where SLSQ has been slow to adapt. We will need members who have considered stepping into leadership roles to take that next step. Mudjimba is fortunate to have a strong pool of experienced, skilled, and motivated members who can mentor and support the club's continued growth.

I am particularly committed to exploring ways to reduce patrolling hours and develop strategies that allow members to enjoy all aspects of volunteering without

compromising our core responsibility: **to save lives, create great Australians, and build better communities.** I will also be working to align our patrol start and finish times with Lifeguard hours to reduce member fatigue and minimise confusion within the community regarding beach operating times.

I would like to extend my sincere thanks to the Mudjimba SLSC Executive, who work tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure the club continues to operate effectively and move forward. To our training team, TAFs, SMEs, officials, coaches, age managers and Water Safety personnel—your ongoing dedication is the backbone of this club, and Mudjimba would not be what it is without your consistent effort.

Enjoy the winter months, take a well-earned break, keep up your training, catch a wave when you can, and I look forward to working with you all again for the 2026–2027 season.

As Treasurer of the Mudjimba Surf Life Saving Club for many years now, I have witnessed significant growth and development within the club. From our newer members brings fresh eyes to the club, maturing in skills and taking on more responsibility, to the expansion of our facilities and the acquisition of top-tier equipment, it's been an exciting journey.

Financial stability is critical to the smooth operation of the club, and we work diligently to ensure that every purchase is made with the overall betterment of the club in mind. Decisions are discussed and voted on by the Executive team, and I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to my fellow Executive members for their ongoing commitment, attendance, and collaborative approach to the running of the club.

This Year

The audited financial results are available for review, and I am pleased to report that the club's financial position remains strong even though we have posted a deficit for the year due to the constant inflation of insurance fees, the monetary decline in our equipment and the reduction of grant monies received. We have however seen an increase in our cash reserves at the end of the financial year—testament to us looking after the equipment that we have, in order to use another day.

The 2025-2026 year has built upon the foundation laid in previous years. We have continued to foster relationships with sponsors, water safety events, and successfully completed grant applications when needed. These efforts have helped to ensure that the club remains financially viable while continuing to deliver quality services to our members and the broader community.

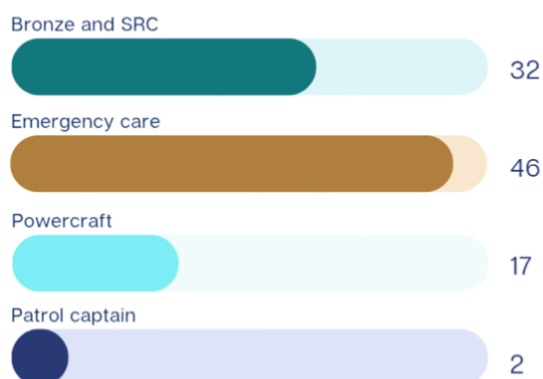


Director of Education and Training

Throughout the 2025/26 season, the education team delivered a broad range of surf lifesaving awards and operational inductions, while continuing to support both new and existing members in maintaining their patrol proficiency and expanding their qualifications. Qualifications were achieved by our members during the season across lifesaving, emergency care, powercraft and patrol operations education pathways.

PATROLLING QUALIFICATIONS



The season also saw continued collaboration with Brisbane Lifesaving and neighbouring clubs, with their members participating in several Mudjimba courses. Our trainers and assessors also worked closely with Branch staff to support delivery of some emergency care courses to ensure continuous access throughout the season. This collaborative approach is necessary however a longer term challenge (and opportunity!) is to build our internal training capacity with additional subject matter experts, Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators.



Despite substantial changes to proficiency requirements and new course materials being introduced, the club achieved strong participation outcomes through scheduled and unscheduled skills maintenance sessions, proactive member follow-up and support from endorsed

delegates. We shifted the focus to completion of skills maintenance as early as possible in the season as well as offering additional sessions on Friday afternoons, which were surprisingly well attended.

The Rainbow Beach SRC/Bronze development pathway continued to grow, with planning, information sessions and preparatory training activities undertaken throughout the season. These youth members have gone on to patrol successfully and contribute valuable skills to some of the rescues that occurred this season.



The club also continued its community education activities, delivering CPR and first aid training to strengthen partnerships with community organisations such as the North Shore Lions. A highlight was having our "Mapleton 2 Mudjimba" program recognised as the Sunshine Coast Community Education program of the year and then being nominated at the national Surf Lifesaving Australia awards. This success provided a platform to secure new funding to continue the Ocean Confidence program during the 2025-26 season through a Sunshine Coast Council grant.





Behind the scenes, longer term planning work undertaken during the season included:

- *Development of forecast budgets and sponsorship proposals for education and training*
- *Implementation planning for use of the Surf Risk Rating system*
- *Strengthening integration between lifesaving operations, surf sports and education functions*

These outcomes would not have been possible without the significant contribution of our volunteer trainers, assessors, endorsed delegates, water safety and administrative team. Their willingness to give their time, share expertise and mentor developing members continues to be one of the club's greatest strengths. On the basis of their efforts, the club is well positioned to continue building capability, strengthening member development pathways and supporting safer beaches into the future.

Patrol 1

The start of the season brought challenging conditions across Mudjimba Beach and the stretch to Discovery, with several rescues undertaken, including a resuscitation performed by the Lifeguards. While Patrol One was fortunate not to be involved in major incidents, these events reinforced the importance of strong preventative measures and maintaining a safe environment for our community. Periods of

dangerous surf and heavy rainfall resulted in several beach closures, prioritising the safety of both the public and our members.

One of the season's memorable moments came during a late-autumn patrol when a strong outward sweep formed beyond the sandbank. We had been watching the movement closely, and it wasn't long before a group of swimmers was suddenly dragged seaward.



Karac reacted instantly — “We’re on” — sprinting into the surf with a rescue tube. Anna followed right behind, and Shippy powered out on the board. With waves rising and swimmers scattered across the bank, the team cut through the chaos with precision. From the tower, Narelle took command, eyes locked on the rescue with the rest of the team backing up ready on standby with power craft and radios.

Within moments, the swimmers were secured and guided safely back to shore, a clear reminder to everyone on the beach of the ocean’s strength. The rescue showcased sharp instincts, teamwork and calm under pressure.

And the memorable part? Despite Shippy’s determined effort, the rescue swimmers beat the board — a detail we won’t let him forget anytime soon.

Beyond lifesaving duties, the team achieved impressive personal milestones. Anna completed a series of ocean swims along the East Coast, including the Bronte to Bondi, Byron Bay, and The Aussies at Kirra Beach to mention a few. Karyn earned another medal in the Champion Lifesaver event at The Aussies and is now competing in Pool Rescue during the off-season. Shippy underwent long-awaited ear surgery, which unfortunately kept him out of the water for several weeks, though he continued to support patrol as well as coaching surf sports from the beach.



We wrapped up the season in style with an exceptional cheese platter curated by Grant — a fitting celebration of a dedicated and successful year.

To the Patrol One team, I want to extend my sincere thanks to everyone for your commitment, professionalism and the positive spirit you bring to every patrol. Your dedication to keeping our community safe, your willingness to step up when needed, and the camaraderie you share make this team something truly special.
