There are some important notes there – firstly a thank you to those who have conducted rescues and assistances – our primary function. Well done. Thank you to those involved in the yacht incident – something unusual that required your adaptation and professional handling. Well done. And please be aware of our dangerous wildlife, snakes, birds and others. Stay safe and keep your crews on the lookout please.

The search for a new vehicle continues. SLSQ has offered to assist our club in the purchase of a replacement which is wonderful news. We are now working through the details and timing. We hope to have this completed shortly. Until then, the use of our vehicle remains restricted – sorry but the risk to all is too great.

I am also still waiting to hear back from SLSQ on the operating agreement for the Rescue Water Craft. I'd like this sorted out quickly so we can get training and using this equipment.

We have another photo shoot day with Ampol and Surf Lifesaving Australia on Wednesday 11 October. I realise this is a school / workday but if you are available and can be at the club in new patrol gear (especially if you are IRB qualified) we'd love to see you there. This is a national promotional program and Mudjimba has the opportunity to be front and centre in it. A great chance to show us off. I will have more details shortly, contact admin or myself the register interest please.

There are a couple of beach clean up programs that are currently being promoted. Please see below for the flyers to register your interest. 
DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION AND TRAINING - GUY TANNER

2023/24 SKILLS MAINTENANCE

Hi all Bronze / SRC and First Aid award members. The annual skills maintenance is available for the coming season. If you patrol or do water safety, you are required to complete the online component found on the SLSA members portal.

Please also note that you only need to complete your CRYMS and child safety when renewing your blue card.

1. Please log on to the SLSA members portal, click the e learning tab on top of the page, then the red e learning tab a bit further down. Once you get to the learnings area, please select 2023 Skills maintenance, as shown in the below picture. Open this and do either the SRC or Bronze skills maintenance. On completion, please take a screen shot of the completion certificate to bring to the practical skills maintenance day.



2. The skills maintenance session dates are below and please advise me of your intended date. (I will advise how to make this booking through the app closer to the time.) This ensures we will have enough assessors available. Depending on your award you will need to do a run swim run, board rescue, tube rescue, resus, and signals. If you have advanced resus and IRB driver and crew, you will need to complete these as well. Sessions will run from 0800 sharp to 1100, maybe a bit later if you hold IRB Driver and Crew. Please bring the screen shot of your completion certificate of the online skills maintenance.
