SECURITY



Whilst it is this Board's intention to make our clubhouse a welcoming place for all members and the community, a recent security audit has identified a few areas for the club to investigate to ensure clubhouse security and member security is maintained. One significant area of concern is the regular changing of the security access codes to doors and security systems. This is just an advanced notification that these codes will be required to be changed regularly. If you require clubhouse access to perform your role you will be advised of these changes prior to these changes being implemented, equally there will be deliberate attention to ensuring these password/code holders are registered (so we know who to contact for any future changes) and that these codes remain confidential. Whilst all Directors, Officers, Patrol Captains, Vice-Captains and Life Guards will be provided with any changes, contact our Administration if you wish to request addition to our security register.

DIRECTOR OF JUNIOR ACTIVITES

Less than one week to go before the first day of Nippers commence, we have 95% of age managers having completed their skills maintenance and online courses. Just a few things to check before we are all systems go.

We will be up skilling our Age Managers with skills maintenance and introducing a brand-new role to parents in the U6 to U8's called NAA (Nipper Adult Assistant) which provides an opportunity for individuals to take on a beach and aquatic supervision role without completing a fitness orientated award (SRC or Bronze). NAA's are qualified to provide water supervision and 'shallow water' activities (such as wading) at a depth deemed appropriate for the U6-U8 age groups. They will be equipped with GREEN rashies similar to our existing ORANGE water safety. Branch still

need to fill us in on some qualifying measures that will make this new and exciting role for parents become such an advantage for the program and benefit all involved.

We will off course be guided by the Covid restrictions "Field of Play" requirements set by SLSQ or otherwise guided by government legislation. Hopefully these measures will not hindrance our nipper program too much.
